

We're praising the Lord for local physicians who provided assistance in the clinic such as gynecologic exams and other specialty services for the patients. One of our nurses shared this with us after the trip: 'These past few months I've found myself lost in nurse burnout and compassion fatigue. Going on this trip has reminded me of my calling and has re-charged my compassion.'

In June, we were able to take 50 team members to Honduras to serve in medical and optical clinics. The team was blessed with holding the clinic in the school for ample space to accommodate more than 2300 patients. In our optical clinic, Dr. Perkowski was able to see many children which was a special blessing. Additionally, at the request of the government, we had the opportunity to treat several prisoners. In our medical clinic, our team provided education focused on diabetes and hypertension with visual aids created by our interns. We also assisted a boy with severe asthma by providing a nebulizer and enough medication for at least six months. We are thankful for God re-igniting the burden for missions in some of our team members, and praising Him for two families visiting the church the following Sunday.

We received testimony after the trip that even Muslims had given their life to Christ, which is extremely rare in this culture. One patient in particular had been waiting for 10 years to receive a hernia repair, and we were honored to be able to provide the necessary surgery. Another patient had been evaluated on a trip in 2021, and was able to receive a laparoscopic cholecystectomy when we returned in 2022. We love to see the impact on patients and team members alike. A nurse on our team shared this after the trip: "I love to travel, but getting to travel and work as a team surrounded by other fellow believers is truly one of the most rewarding experiences. This trip was so refreshing spiritually for me as I had the opportunity to talk with several people one-on-one about some of the challenges we face in life and encouraging each other to remain resilient even during the hardest of times whether family issues, illness, or other life stress. I seriously already can't wait to go on another MMO trip."

We took a mobile-clinic approach on this trip to try and visit as many villages as possible. While patient count was lower than our usual trips, we had the special blessing of treating a group of Venezuelan refugees one day. Thankfully we had several Spanish-speaking team members who were able to interpret and facilitate their care. One of the team members said "God used my time with MMO in Trinidad to remind me that His timing is always perfect and that trusting Him is always worth it." Another team member shared "I learned so much about God's sovereignty and His involvement in everything we did. I was also reminded that we serve a God above time and circumstance and He is able to do things far greater than we could ever think of or imagine. Using my medical skills to serve the kingdom was wonderful, but true joy was knowing at least 15 people came to know Christ during that time!"

We had the privilege of partnering with Project South Africa who are collectively involved with 10 local churches. Many of the church members served with us throughout the week, and were vital given the multiple languages spoken in South Africa. Project South Africa conducts a local Bible college, and those students were eager to evangelize to their community. We experienced long patient lines every day, with many of them standing in line overnight just to be seen in the clinic. This heart-breaking realization truly showed us the need for basic care in this area. In addition to the patients seen in clinic, we were also able to hand out anti-parasitics to about 300 people in line, and we were able to provide reading glasses to about 300 others who were not able to be seen in our optical clinic. After the trip, one of the team members said "I was reminded that it's not about me and/or what I can do, but it is all for His glory!" Pastor Mark shared that they had 23 visitors at church the following Sunday.

Our team was blessed to visit Mongolia and stay in a beautiful, old Russian wool factory. Before we even made it to the clinic site, the Lord was already working. When we initially arrived in Mongolia, our luggage was confiscated by customs. The team had a brief hotel stay to freshen up and get a few hours of sleep before returning to the airport. Upon return, the customs agent found the team and said she couldn't sleep all night and wanted to return our luggage before the next flight. She thanked us for coming to love and provide care for her people. The team was able to see three times what was expected for the remote area, and the church attendance doubled the Sunday after our team left. We're also praising the Lord for one patient trusting Christ at a provider's table during clinic. The pastor told us that this is an unusual response to the Gospel in this area. We were humbly reminded all things are possible with God.



We took a team of mostly Tribe members to the breathtaking Galapagos Islands. Though we were surrounded by beautiful scenery, we were struck by the desperate need of the islanders. The team partnered with several local churches that are led by Pastor Franco. Our team provided diabetic and hypertensive education, and oral hygiene booklets were given to children in the dental clinic. One of our team members was also able to offer pregnancy ultrasounds using the Butterfly ultrasound. This was such a blessing, especially for some of the women who were seeing their baby for the very first time. We are praising God that we were able to meet the need in a community that feels forgotten and neglected by their healthcare system.

# Rearick Surgical Center El Progreso, Honduras

We returned to the RSC to provide both general and orthopedic surgical procedures to the Honduran people. Our team evaluated 57 patients, gave 4 knee injections, and performed 30 surgical procedures including hernia repairs, ACL repairs and hardware removal. Many patients had been waiting a long time for their surgeries and it was a huge blessing to hear their stories. One patient in particular is a taxi driver who was in a head-on collision and had a fractured humerus. We were able to get him transported to our facility and put in a plate. Although we didn't have many orthopedic cases prior to the trip, God knew that this patient would require our team and equipment the exact week we were there. One of our nurses really captured the heart of what we do and why we do it: "I was reminded of how much God can use just simply loving people and treating them with dignity to further the Gospel!"
